

Guidelines for Planning a Study Visit to Germany

- Please start planning your study visit three months prior your departure. Due to an increase of visit requests, we regret to inform you that we cannot accept inquiries on a short-term notice.
- While planning your study visit, please be aware of public holidays in the region of your destination. The Carnival period (usually in February) and the months of April/May are rather inconvenient due a accumulation of public holidays.
- Remember to apply for a German visa in time (if required).
- We recommend hiring a professional tutor and a skilled interpreter for the duration of the study visit. The ideal length of a study visit is about five days.
- Find out more about the German VET system by visiting our website, which provides presentations, brochures and more.
- Define your specific interests in advance as accurately as possible and emphasize the main focus of your visit.

- Structure of the German vocational education and training system
 - The different roles of the stakeholders involved
 - Costs and benefits / Financing of the German VET system
 - German VET standards
 - Training regulations and how they come about
 - Certification and recognition issues
 - Quality assurance in the German VET system
 - How to build up a training centre
 - Training of trainers
 - What does „Handlungskompetenz“ mean and how it comes about
 - Transition from school to VET (Vocational guidance and preparation of students)
 - VET research: Vocational Training Report, Data Report, labor market forecasts
 - „Green“ jobs in the context of sustainable resource management
 - German providers in international VET cooperation

 - To gain an insight into the German dual system, the following order of visits might be beneficial:
 - System overview at GOVET
 - Side visit of a company (Work-based learning)
 - Side visit of a vocational school
 - Visit of a local chamber
 - Visit of the social partners (workers/employers' association)
 - Visit of a training centre
 - Final discussion/Wrap-up at GOVET (reflection of study visit; outlook)
